## York Healthy City Board

### Terms of reference

The terms of reference for the Healthy City Board are:

1. To collectively understand and steer policies and actions to deliver the top level objective of the Healthy City Theme :  
*“To be a city where residents enjoy long, healthy and independent lives through the promotion of healthy living and with easy access to responsive health and social care services.”*
2. To ensure that constituent partners have plans in place to deliver the strategic aims and that delivery is monitored:
  - To engage the community of York in the planning and development of health and social care services and pathways.
  - To jointly commission health and social care services from a variety of providers to meet the needs of the population, combining the expertise and resources of the NHS and Local Authority.
  - To identify and address inequalities in health outcomes and in the determinants of health.
  - To prevent ill health and promote well being by supporting individuals and communities to make healthy choices, with tailored interventions for those who are least likely to make these choices:
  - To make sure that those with risk factors or with ill health are identified as early as possible and offered appropriate treatment.
  - To support individuals to ‘self care’ and become experts in managing their own condition. Wherever possible to allow individuals to commission or direct the commissioning of personalised services that are tailored to their own choices.
  - To develop safe, effective, quality services in the right settings, as close to home as is possible and clinically appropriate.
  - To provide care in an integrated way that allows patients to navigate their care pathway smoothly. Where appropriate integrate services.
  - To plan ahead so that the employed and carer workforces are skilled and supported to meet future needs.
  - To work across the relevant partnerships in the city to achieve shared aims.
3. To monitor health outcomes and quality of life in the city. To oversee the production of the Joint Strategic Needs Assessment.
4. To be responsible for monitoring LAA target delivery as a lead or co-lead partnership.
  - All-age all cause mortality rate
  - Alcohol-harm related hospital admission rates
  - Obesity among primary school age children in year 6

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- Under 18 conception rate
  - Social care clients receiving Self Directed Support (Direct Payments and Individual Budgets)
  - Carers receiving needs assessment or review and a specific carer's service, or advice and information
  - Number of vulnerable people achieving independent living
  - User reported measure of respect and dignity in their treatment
  - People over 65 who say that they receive the information, assistance and support needed to exercise choice and control to live independently
  - Reduce health inequalities within the local area, by narrowing the gap in all-age, all-cause mortality
  - Additional national indicators or vital signs where the area becomes an outlier from national performance
5. To work across partnerships to deliver a healthier city, learning from experience elsewhere.
  6. To contribute to wider sustainable community strategy themes.
  7. To report through the Chair to the Without Walls Board and through the members to the relevant organisational and cross-organisational bodies.
